

RIDING THE ROADS!!

Simple tips to follow when riding or driving your horse along NJ's roads:

Always wear
An ASTM/SEI
Certified
riding
HELMET

Ride in the same direction as cars are going. by law, cars must slow down to at least 25 mph



A boot with a good heel is a must to keep your foot from slipping through the stirrup.

Use a hand signal or other form of signal to have cars coming in the opposite direction stop 'til you safely pass



Keeep dogs and small children away from your horse. A horse can get easily startled by the antics of dogs. Small children must be watched carefully.

Bright colored clothing or an orange pinney or safety vest lets drivers see you coming. Don't wear loose or bagging clothing.
