Give Us The Brake

Slow down to at least 25 mph when you see a horse and rider or other horse drawn vehicle on either side of the roads

If the rider or driver gives a hand or other signal, cars traveling in the opposite direction must come to a complete stop until the horse or horse drawn vehicle passes safely

Traffic

Horse-drawn vehicles and horseback riders have the same rights and responsibilities as motor vehicles when using the highways.

Horse-drawn vehicles and horseback riders must ride with the traffic – keeping as far to the right as possible.
